ORDER REGULATING PROCEEDINGS

Pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 83(b), in all 28 U.S.C. § 2241 petitions in which either the Secretary or Acting Secretary of the United States Department of Homeland Security, or the Director or Acting Director of United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement, or anyone acting under their authority is a respondent, in order to preserve the Court's jurisdiction and ability to order an effective remedy, Respondents shall neither remove Petitioner from this District nor allow Petitioner to be removed from this District unless and until the Court orders otherwise. See, 28 U.S.C. § 1651; F.T.C. v. Dean Foods Co., 384 U.S. 597, 603 (1966) ("The All Writs Act, 28 U.S.C. § 1651(a), empowers the federal courts to 'issue all writs necessary or appropriate in aid of their respective jurisdictions and agreeable to the usages and principles of law.""); Local 1814, Int'l Longshoremen's Ass 'n v. New York Shipping Ass'n, 965 F.2d 1224, 1237 (2d Cir. 1992) ("Once the district court acquires jurisdiction over the subject matter of, and the parties to, the litigation, the All Writs Act [28 U.S.C. § 1651] authorizes a

federal court to protect that jurisdiction.").

The Clerk is ORDERED to file a copy of this order on the docket immediately in any such case. This order should not be construed as an expression of the Court's views on the merits of any case it affects. See, e.g., Wheaton College v. Burwell, 573 U.S. 958, 134 S. Ct. 2806, 2807 (2014); Little Sisters of the Poor Home for the Aged v. Sebelius, 571 U.S. 1171, 134 S. Ct. 1022, 1022 (2014).

The Clerk is DIRECTED (1) immediately to serve Respondents with a copy of the petition and accompanying papers, along with a copy of this Order, by e-mail to the United States Attorney's Office for the Southern District of Ohio and by overnight mail; and (2) to promptly file proof of such service on the docket. Counsel for Respondents shall promptly enter notices of appearance.
