GENERAL ORDER 24-03

On November 1, 2023, the United States Sentencing Commission amended U.S.S.G. § 4A1.1 and promulgated U.S.S.G. § 4C1.1, both of which pertain to the calculation of a defendant's criminal history score and base offense level. As these Sentencing Guidelines Amendments apply retroactively, this Court published General Order 23-04 appointing the Federal Public Defender ("FPD") to review the list of defendants who may be eligible for relief under these Amendments. To allow for the FPD's review in tandem with United States Attorney's Office ("USAO") and United States Probation ("USP"), this Court issued General Order 23-05, which suspended Local Rule 7.2(a)'s the twenty-one (21) day response time as to any motions seeking relief under these

The FPD has now notified this Court that the initial review of defendants is complete. Therefore, as of this date, this Court rescinds General Order 23-05, and Local Rule 7.2.(a)(2) applies to all such motions going forward, effective as of the date of this Order. The USAO will now have twenty-one (21) days from the date of this Order to respond to any outstanding motions,

Amendments until such time as the FPD notifies the Court that the review process is complete.

any reply to which shall then be filed within fourteen (14) days after the date of service of the response. General Order 23-04 remains in place.

It is hereby **ORDERED** that General Order 23-05 is **RESCINDED**.
