herein are fixed as the collateral to be forfeited in lieu of appearance by any person charged with the

corresponding violation of federal law by violation notice.

Nothing contained in this General Order prohibits or restricts otherwise existing authority

of any law enforcement officer to arrest persons charged with violations of federal criminal law.

This General Order is effective for violations occurring on or after April 1, 2012. Prior

orders on collateral forfeiture are vacated as of that date, except that persons issued violation notices

before that date may forfeit the collateral listed in the prior order.

Mandatory Appearances: Law enforcement officers with authority to make arrests and issue Violation Notices for offenses against the United States may exercise the discretion to require a defendant's mandatory appearance before the presiding United States Magistrate Judge when, in that officer's judgment, the offense is of an aggravated nature. Recidivism, failure to comply upon notice, and serious public safety offenses may be considered by the citing officer. Additionally, when restitution to the United States or any other victim exceeds the value of fines and restitution pursuant to this collateral forfeiture schedule, mandatory appearance may be considered. Nothing herein shall prohibit the law enforcement officer from arresting a person for the commission of any offense against the United States, including those for which collateral may be posted in lieu of appearance.

<u>Organizations:</u> Due to increased liability and potential for severe environmental degradation posed by commercial and organized activities, the collateral amounts for violations listed herein committed by an organization shall be doubled. Organization includes a corporation, government or government agency, business, trust, estate, partnership, association, church, club, hunting club, or any other legal entity where two or more persons have a joint or common interest.

**Restitution Valuation:** Where "+" is noted after the collateral amount, restitution may be added to that collateral amount. Refer to the valuation table to determine restitution amounts for natural resource offenses.
